4. Chair Report

Chair J. Bonigut provided a breakdown of the QSP – 2018 Fundraiser. She advised the group that it is time to lay to rest this fundraiser as we have participated in the QSP Fundraiser for the past 3. This year's total raised \$1,006.00. Thank you to all who participated and supported the school.

5. Treasurer Report

It was discussed that the agreement of the group that we would allocate 40% of the fundraising to long term goals and 60 % to short term goals for St. Charles.

Items that were discussed were technology and accessories. – St. Charles Catholic School was gifted 13 iPads from the Simcoe Muskoka Catholic School Board, but the accessories that come along with placing these iPads in the classrooms require the protective cases and tubs for storage. The approximate costs for these accessories will cost \$400.00.

Other suggestions were made as to where 60 % of the monies should be spent were:

Document Camera approximate \$196.00

Reimbursement to Teachers at a cost of \$50.00 per classroom for items that teachers have bought throughout the school year.

Busing \$495.11 for bringing children to Church for the 2017-2018 school year.

All members were in agreement of the expenditures listed above.

8. **Fundraising**

2018-2019 St. Charles Catholic School Committee discussed the upcoming school year and fundraising ideas. The upcoming school year requires that the application be completed and submitted to the Simcoe Muskoka Catholic District School Board before the end of this school year for approvals. We are permitted to have 2 major fundraising and 2 minor fundraising events.

The group were presented with various ideas as follows: Major Fundraising Ideas:

Discussions regarding a Rummage Sale was had and decided that due to consultation and discussion with the school boards rules and regulations this fundraising idea did no meet the requirements of school board's policies. The rental fee of tables and the amount of work required did not seem to be feasible to the group to run such a fundraising campaign. The Associate Director at the Board advised that the facilities own by the board are to be used for not for profit. Another concern would be the gyms occupant load under fire regulations and the liability. The committee decided that the rummage sale would not be one of the major fundraising ideas due to its complexity.
