EQAO Results:

Primary: 86%/76%/71% Junior: 905%/90%/29%

Math marks are down across the province. EQAO is reviewing the test, as there maybe a disconnect between how students are asked to show what they know and how they are being taught in the classroom. In classrooms we know that students learn best when they can work together, collaborate, talk and use manipulates, struggle and persevere.

CSCC Liability Insurance:

The School Council liability insurance coverage is a General Liability Policy that provides protection for School Councils when they participate in events and activities that are not under the direct control of the school board. The cost is \$140.00 plus PST - \$151.20

Treasurer Report:

Two sources of monies for our school:

- 1. Ministry of Education (GSN)
- 2. School Generated Funds (SGF)

 - This money comes in from the community and goes back out to the school in a variety of ways:
 - Bussing
 - Trips for students who can't afford
 - Augment resources (guided reading books)
 - Technology
 - Phys. Ed Equipment
 - Library Books
 - Breaking bread, building community and celebrating together is an important part of a Catholic Learning Community. Some of the monies generated from hot lunches with be used for this purpose:
 - Volunteer lunch
 - Seniors Teas (Remembrance Day)
 - Providing teachers dinner during parent/teacher and or concert evening.
 - Lunch and learns for teachers on PA days
